IMPORTANT NOTES:

Students are not required to follow the Roadmap to its exact recommendation. However, degree core classes are designed to be taught in this order.

This Roadmap assumes student has completed foreign language requirement.

This Roadmap assumes student has not completed any AP, IB, CLEP, dual enrollment, or transfer credit.

It is the student's responsibility to make sure they have met all requirements to graduate by referencing the appropriate checksheet for their date of entry as well as checking their DARs on HokieSPA semesterly.

All classes require a D- to pass unless otherwise stated in the course catalog. However, Students must earn a 2.0 overall and in-major GPA to graduate.

Free electives are any class that counts towards graduation. Many students will fulfill free electives through double majors or adding minors. Note, the purpose of free electives is to reach 120 credits to graduate. The number of free electives a student takes relies entirely on how many credits are needed to reach 120 after all class requirements are met.

A class can only count toward one pathways area unless the class is approved for a Pathways 7 and another area.

¹Two SOC 2000 level electives should be completed before SOC 3104. Most 2000 level electives can also double count as a Pathways 3.

²12 credits of CRIM Electives are required. Students must choose from a pre-approved list of electives located on CRIM Checksheet.
